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1. INTRODUCTION

1.1. COLLEGIATE TRIATHLON AND THE WCCTC

The West Coast Collegiate Triathlon Conference (WCCTC), founded in 2005, is an association of the colleges and universities of the state of California and western Nevada. The WCCTC is recognized as the governing body for the sport of collegiate triathlon within California and western Nevada. WCCTC offices are located in Santa Barbara, CA.

1.2. BACKGROUND

Intercollegiate competition has been a cornerstone of organized sports in this country for over 100 years. Collegiate athletics have provided millions of students the opportunity to participate in their sport during college, not only recreationally, but also as a development ground for Olympic-caliber athletes. As of 2005, aside from an annual national championship, there had been no concerted effort to facilitate broader development of collegiate triathlon within the United States. Seeing this and recognizing the overwhelming growth of the sport of triathlon across the United States, over 500 student-triathletes representing a number of schools from California and western Nevada banded together to develop the structure for intercollegiate competition for the sport of triathlon themselves. The result was the WCCTC, which we hope will be a model for collegiate triathlon across the United States and the foundation for a National Collegiate Triathlon Association.

1.3. WCCTC MISSION STATEMENT

The WCCTC has identified the following Mission Statement: "The mission of the West Coast Collegiate Triathlon Conference is to administer, develop and promote collegiate triathlon within California and western Nevada. The WCCTC shall annually determine team and individual Conference Champions, and shall pursue a leadership role regionally and nationally to foster collegiate triathlon."

To achieve this, the WCCTC shall:

- Establish membership policy and certify clubs and athletes as members.
- Appoint and supervise a Conference Director.
- Facilitate a yearly Conference Championship event.
- Pursue financial support for its mission and its members.
- Foster communication with other collegiate triathlon teams and conferences.

1.4. ORGANIZATIONAL GOALS

The following goals have been established by the WCCTC:

- 1.4.1. Develop competitive triathlon programs in a format that is compatible with extramural and intramural sporting programs at colleges and universities.
- 1.4.2. Organize a yearly official WCCTC race season comprised primarily of races hosted by member colleges and universities.
- 1.4.3. Conduct a Collegiate Conference Championship in the disciplines covered by WCCTC racing programs.
- 1.4.4. Coordinate with external organizations, as appropriate, to aid in continuing existing collegiate programs and to expand the scope of collegiate triathlon.
- 1.4.5. Facilitate connections between well-respected coaches and WCCTC teams.
- 1.4.6. Be the largest introducer of college-aged athletes to the sport of triathlon.
- 1.4.7. Keep the program cost effective because the WCCTC deals mainly with college students and beginning racers.
- 1.4.8. Encourage the academic and athletic development of the student-athlete in the sport of triathlon.

2. GOVERNANCE

2.1. WCCTC STRUCTURE

The West Coast Collegiate Triathlon Conference (WCCTC) is governed by an Executive Board composed of one representative from each member school ("Team Reps"). The WCCTC governance structure is defined in its bylaws, which are included in this document. The administration of the WCCTC is the responsibility of the Conference Director in cooperation with the Executive Board. The Executive Board has the responsibility of developing policy and long-term goals for collegiate triathlon, as well as programs to be implemented, taking the athletes' input and best interests into consideration. Any changes to the WCCTC bylaws become effective only after they are ratified by the Executive Board.

2.2. PURPOSE

- 2.2.1. The purpose of this document is to provide the rules and regulations for collegiate triathlon competition at the conference-level. All USAT racing rules apply to USAT Sanctioned events. Rules for external events are set by the external event organizers.

2.3. ROLE OF THE WCCTC CONFERENCE

The WCCTC is made up of member schools only. All information relative to events, event scheduling, racing programs, Conference Championships, and membership applications and requirements, can be obtained from the Director. The WCCTC Director is appointed by the WCCTC Team Reps as part of the Executive Board. If a Director does not choose to continue or is dismissed, member clubs shall submit candidate recommendations by the Team Reps to the acting Director. Upon receiving one or more nominations, the acting Director shall put to a vote all candidates for the new Director position. As decided by the WCCTC, the Conference is required to hold one Conference Championships each race season. The WCCTC shall establish policy with respect to student athlete eligibility, rules and regulations, athlete disciplinary procedures, event permitting, and is responsible for approving all Conference rules and regulations. The Conference manages its own budget, racing calendar, and monitors athlete eligibility policies.

2.4. CONFERENCE ADMINISTRATION

- 2.4.1. The Conference is administered by a Director. The Director is an officer position on the Executive Board and is a volunteer position under the general supervision of the Team Reps.
- 2.4.2. The Conference has an e-mail list to which Team Reps or any team members may subscribe. However, this list shall be used primarily for issuing announcements to, or soliciting information from Team Reps. The directions on how to subscribe to this list shall be conveyed to all teams in the Conference by the Director.

- 2.4.3. The Conference e-mail list may be used for publishing information to members of the Conference all at once.
- 2.4.4. The Conference has a website. This website should be used for publishing information about the Conference, including: contact info, current teams in good standing, the Conference race schedule, race results, press releases, etc.

2.5. DEFINITIONS

- 2.5.1. *WCCTC*: West Coast Collegiate Triathlon Conference.
- 2.5.2. *USAT*: USA Triathlon.
- 2.5.3. *Director*: Conference Director.
- 2.5.4. *WCCTC Team*: A triathlon club or team affiliated with and representing a post-secondary school accepted into the WCCTC.
- 2.5.5. *WCCTC Athlete*: A full time student on a WCCTC Team in good standing with the University, team and WCCTC.
- 2.5.6. *Team Rep.*: A WCCTC athlete who acts as the official WCCTC representative for his/her team on the Executive Board.
- 2.5.7. *Board*: Executive Board, the governing entity of the WCCTC, composed of Team Reps.
- 2.5.8. *Event*: A single scoring triathlon or other race.
- 2.5.9. *External Event*: A single scoring opportunity, put on by any other organization.

- 2.5.10. *Dual Event*: An event which occurs on the same weekend as another official event.
- 2.5.11. *Event Score*: The total points scored during an event.
- 2.5.12. *School*: A post-secondary, degree-granting institution.
- 2.5.13. *Sprint*: Any event shorter than an Olympic or International Distance.

2.6. ANNUAL MEETINGS

- 2.6.1. The Director shall conduct an annual meeting to discuss the issues of the Conference, as well as to schedule the upcoming race season. This meeting shall take place in the Fall or some other time prior to the start of the subsequent competitive season. Thirty (30) days prior to the meeting a written notice must be given to each club informing them of the time and location. Written notice may be sent via US Mail or may take the form of an email sent via the WCCTC email list. The time and location of said meeting is solely at the discretion of the Director but should attempt to accommodate as many member schools as possible.
- 2.6.2. Clubs may request agenda items no later than two weeks prior to the meeting. If requested, the agenda shall be distributed to all club contacts one week prior to the meeting.
- 2.6.3. On each issue brought to a vote, each school shall receive only one vote. Said vote is to be made only by the officially recognized Team Rep.
- 2.6.4. The Director shall vote only in case of a tie. The Director may call additional meetings if necessary.

2.7. CONFERENCE FINANCES

- 2.7.1. The Director may receive financial assistance, made available through the Conference account to offset expenses incurred for the administration of the Conference.
- 2.7.2. The Conference may adopt Conference dues, late fees, and/or athlete surcharges (on race entry fees) that go directly to the Conference.
 - 2.7.2.1. Team fees are payable to: **WCCTC Conference Due c/o J. Ritterbeck, Director**. Please remember to include the name of the WCCTC Team on the memo line. Mail to: 204 Saratoga Ct., Santa Barbara, CA 93117.
- 2.7.3. The Director shall prepare a year-end financial statement of the Conference. The fiscal year runs from September 1st to August 31st. The financial statement shall be sent to each Team Rep or the Director may choose to present the statement at the annual Conference meeting.
- 2.7.4. Any Conference dues/surcharges must be included in the financial statement prepared by the Director.
- 2.7.5. If any monies are available, the Team Reps must approve how those monies are to be spent (e.g., scholarships for athletes, support for athletes attending National Championship events, Conference-owned equipment for other Conference uses).

3. MEMBERSHIP

3.1. TEAMS

- 3.1.1. Each WCCTC team must be officially recognized as an official student organization by its post-secondary school and a registered club/organization with USAT.
- 3.1.2. WCCTC teams must apply for membership each year by filling out the WCCTC team application and paying the appropriate club membership fee to the WCCTC. WCCTC team applications may be found on the WCCTC website or obtained from the Director. All membership applications must be submitted to the Director by November 1st of each year.
 - 3.1.2.1. **The Conference currently has a \$20.00 membership fee for each WCCTC Team.**
- 3.1.3. WCCTC teams are required to be located in California or western Nevada. Teams outside this area may apply for an exception. All petitions for exceptions must be sent by September 30th to the Director.

3.2. ATHLETES

- 3.2.1. WCCTC individual members must be full-time students and in good standing, as defined by the Bursar Office or Office of the Registrar at the member's post-secondary school.
- 3.2.2. Upon graduation, a registered WCCTC team member has an additional 6 months of Conference eligibility where they can continue racing and scoring for their respective team. After 6 months they can remain on the team but will be ineligible to score points. Team Reps must notify the Director of any team members who fall into this category.
- 3.2.3. Individual WCCTC members must remain in good standing with the WCCTC team at their school. A team may disqualify any member of their own team from scoring in an event for any reason.
- 3.2.4. Individuals must be assigned an official WCCTC number in order to score at a Conference event. Team membership fees must be paid prior to WCCTC numbers being assigned to that team. Payment and receipt of a WCCTC number is required prior to any race for which an individual wishes to score for a team and in no case shall this rule be waved or shall numbers be made retroactive for scoring purposes.
- 3.2.5. WCCTC numbers are assigned by the Director prior to the beginning of each race season and must be renewed every year. WCCTC numbers are not transferred from year to year. A returning WCCTC member will receive a new number each year they participate in Conference events.
- 3.2.6. Teams with new members joining after the race season has begun may submit a request new WCCTC numbers for those members no later than the 5 days prior to the Conference event for which that member wishes to score.
- 3.2.7. Proof of active full-time status shall be submitted to Team Reps for each team member prior to the team roster being sent to the Director for issuance of WCCTC numbers. At any time during a race season the Director may ask for current proof of an individual's academic status or standing.
- 3.2.8. Team Reps are responsible for collecting and sending to the Director all team fees (\$20.00 per team) and proof of full-time enrollment upon request during the race season. New individual members may join the Conference during the race season.

4. ELIGIBILITY

- 4.1.1. Teams must be members in good standing with USA Triathlon in order to compete in WCCTC events.
- 4.1.2. To participate in WCCTC events, athletes must be WCCTC individual members as defined in Section 3.2.
- 4.1.3. Athletes must race for the school at which they are enrolled. Teams that allow athletes from non-WCCTC schools to join their team shall not submit those individuals to the Director for Conference numbers for WCCTC event scoring purposes.
- 4.1.4. All athletes must present a USAT license to compete, or must purchase a one-day license to compete in a Collegiate event. Annual and one day licenses can be obtained at events.
 - 4.1.4.1. This rule will not be enforced by the Conference unless an individual WCCTC event has been sanctioned by the USAT. Sanctioning of an event is the sole discretion of the event's Race Director.
- 4.1.5. Any ineligible athlete shall forfeit his/her points; the team must also forfeit all points earned by that ineligible athlete. Where as, if an ineligible athlete scores in the top 5 for a WCCTC school, that individual shall be removed from the results and the team will only earn points from their school's top 4 scoring athletes.
- 4.1.6. Schools that have more than one geographically separate campus, each of which grants a separate degree, must develop a separate WCCTC team for each campus location.
- 4.1.7. No school or team shall develop eligibility requirements that may unduly hamper or deny any student from participating on a team during regular season events when the student is otherwise qualified.
- 4.1.8. Professional triathletes and former professional triathletes shall be allowed to compete in WCCTC events, subject to proof of eligibility.
- 4.1.9. International students are eligible to compete in all WCCTC events, as long as they meet the above mentioned eligibility requirements.

4.2. TEAM STATUS

- 4.2.1. Sponsorship of a team is allowed with the condition that the income from the sponsor goes to the entire team and not directly to any specific individual. Teams may decide how to allocate their sponsorship.
- 4.2.2. The school's name or initials must appear on the racing uniform of a WCCTC team member and must be the largest and most prominent name or logo on the front and back of the jersey. If no school name or logo appears on the racing uniform, said uniform shall be void of all other logos, graphics, names, lettering or otherwise and shall be considered "blank". However, a small designer name brand or logo otherwise found on stock retail merchandise shall be exempt on "blank" uniforms.
- 4.2.3. For each official WCCTC team, every individual member racing and scoring for that team shall participate wearing the officially recognized uniform for that team and should all be of similar color and design so as to be easily distinguishable from team members of other WCCTC schools.
- 4.2.4. Sponsors' logos may appear in addition, provided they are smaller than the school name or initials. The Director reserves the right to disapprove team jersey designs.
- 4.2.5. No uniform from a non-conference team or club may be worn at any WCCTC event. Any individual in violation of Team Status rules shall be rendered ineligible. (See 4.1.5)

4.3. DISCIPLINARY PROCEDURES

- 4.3.1. All disciplinary actions are determined by the Director and must be approved by the Board.
- 4.3.2. Due process must be followed in imposing any discipline, including fair notice and an opportunity for the offender to present evidence in his or her defense.
- 4.3.3. The WCCTC may suspend any participant from competition for repeated violation of Conference rules. Suspensions may any length, but no longer than through the end of the next racing season.

5. COLLEGIATE EVENTS

5.1. RULES

- 5.1.1. WCCTC recommends that events follow the racing rules of USA Triathlon. Any team choosing not to have their event sanctioned by the USAT should notify athletes in advance of the race. However, it is the athletes' responsibility to familiarize themselves with the rules and safety measures in effect for each individual event.
- 5.1.2. Prizes in the form of cash or merchandise, or otherwise, are allowed; the WCCTC does not regulate the distribution of prizes.
- 5.1.3. Official WCCTC events may have non-collegiate divisions.
- 5.1.4. Any previous Conference Omnium Champion should be acknowledged before the start of a Conference Championship race.

5.2. SEASON AND CALENDAR

- 5.2.1. The WCCTC race season is composed of races approved by the Board to be part of the official race calendar. These races may be events hosted by member schools or external events unaffiliated with member schools.
- 5.2.2. The Conference may set the dates during which the official race season may occur. However, the race season should occur when a majority of member schools are in session and be between the months of February to May, inclusive.
- 5.2.3. Only one official Conference event may occur on any given weekend, unless an exception to this rule is approved by the Board prior to the beginning of the race season. Dual races should only be approved in special circumstances to accommodate schools separated by large geographic distances (i.e. 300 miles or more) that can demonstrate undue hardship in altering a requested race date. Dual races have special scoring criteria.
 - 5.2.3.1. For the **2007-2008 race season** no exception to this rule is made.

5.3. RACE SELECTION PROCESS

- 5.3.1. Schools planning to host a race must notify the Director of the proposed date by January 1st. An official race bid shall be submitted to the Director and priority shall be given to those schools whose requests for specific dates are received first. Race bids should contain the following information: Event name, Race Director contact information, costs, distances, race maps, estimated wave start times, as well as a preferred alternative race date if possible.
- 5.3.2. External events that wish to be part of the official calendar must notify the Director by January 1st.
- 5.3.3. External events are eligible to be added to the calendar if the external event:
 - 5.3.3.1. Recognizes the WCCTC as the governing body of collegiate triathlon in California and western Nevada.
 - 5.3.3.2. Agrees to follow WCCTC scoring procedures if they announce or publish team results.
 - 5.3.3.3. Provides a discount of at least 30% off their normal entry fees. A discount of 50% is suggested.
 - 5.3.3.4. The Collegiate Division must have its own wave start(s).
 - 5.3.3.4.1. Race Directors may allow Elite or Professional level athletes to start with the Collegiate Division if there is no other appropriate wave or start time to accommodate these athletes.
 - 5.3.3.5. Collegiate athletes may not be bumped out of the Collegiate Division results for any reason (such as placing high overall) other than for disqualification.
 - 5.3.3.6. The Board may exempt a race from these regulations. Current races given an exemption include:
 - USAT Collegiate National Championships
- 5.3.4. The Director will compile the proposed race calendar periodically and submit to the Board for approval.

5.4. DISTANCES

- 5.4.1. Suggested minimum event distances: **Swim**: 400 meters; **Bike**: 15 kilometers; **Run**: 5 kilometers

- 5.4.2. Conference Championships MUST consist of an event with *minimum* distances of: **Swim**: 800 meters; **Bike**: 15 kilometers, **Run**: 5 kilometers, but shall exceed a *maximum* of: **Swim**: 1500 meters, **Bike**: 40 kilometers, **Run**: 10 kilometers.

5.5. FEES

- 5.5.1. The Conference may cap entry fees for the collegiate division of school-hosted events. WCCTC races are capped at:
Sprint: \$50 **International / Olympic**: \$70
- 5.5.2. Late fees may be established at the discretion of the host team's Race Director, but shall not exceed \$10. For the WCCTC collegiate division, late fees shall only be made effective a *maximum* of 2 weeks prior to the event.

5.6. RESULTS

- 5.6.1. The results must be sent to the Director within two weeks of the race unless otherwise specified and approved by the Director prior to the race. The Director or his/her designee will compile the results and will have point totals available within two weeks of receiving the race results.
- 5.6.2. The Conference Championship race shall be scored in compliance with Section 5.7 below.
- 5.6.3. The Director shall provide the overall awards for Conference Championships. Team and Individual dues may be used to purchase or subsidize the purchase of Conference Awards.

5.7. CONFERENCE SCORING

- 5.7.1. The Conference may determine how many events count toward the team and individual omnium for the regular season championship.

The following table determines how many events count toward the team and individual omnium. If possible, the season shall balance the number of races located in the northern and southern regions of the Conference.

(Total # of Races, # Scores Counted)

(1, 1) ; (2, 2) ; (3, 2) ; (4, 3) ; (5, 3) ; (6, 4) ; (7, 4) ; (8, 5) ; (9, 5) ; (10, 6) ; (11, 6) ; (12, 7) ; (13, 7) ; (14, 8) ; (15, 8)

- 5.7.1. The Conference may choose to allow bonuses such as double or triple points at Conference or National Championships. Bonuses are applied to both individual and team scores. Points are worth **double** at the WCCTC Championships. Points shall also be worth **double** at the USAT Collegiate National Championships.
- 5.7.2. To account for a diluted competitive field, dual races are scored half as deep as normal events in individual competition, using the point values from odd placings only. (1st place gets 1st place points, 2nd place gets 3rd place points, 3rd place gets 5th place points, etc.). Team scoring is unchanged. This rule is in effect for every season where dual race weekends are approved by the Board. Dual race weekends must be approved prior to the start of the Race Season.
- 5.7.3. The Conference may set a maximum number of participants per school that may score points toward the team total (the "scoring depth"). Other participants from that school displace other competitors; they retain the points as individuals but the points are not awarded to the team. Totaling a team's individual points to the given depth determines each team's placing at each event. Team points are then awarded based on these placings.

The WCCTC scores a maximum of **five** male participants and **five** female participants per school toward the team total.

- 5.7.4. In the case of a tie on total points, the tie will be broken in the favor of the team or individual that has the most first place finishes; or if still tied, the most second place finishes; or if still tied, the most 3rd place finishes, etc.

5.7.5. CONFERENCE INDIVIDUAL POINTS

Individual points at each race are awarded on a logarithmic scale based on the following formula:

$$\text{Points}(p) = F \cdot [1 - \ln(p) / \ln(D+1)]$$

where:

- F = # of points given to 1st place
- D = depth of scoring (e.g. points given to the top 50 places)
- p = the place of each competitor

5.7.6. **CONFERENCE TEAM POINTS**

Team points at each race are awarded on a linear scale based on the following formula:

$$\text{Points}(p) = -(F/D)p + F + D$$

where:

- F = # of points given to 1st place
- D = depth of scoring (e.g. points given to the top 10 places)
- p = the place of each team (determined by totaling a team's individual points)

6. CONFERENCE AWARDS

- 6.1.1. Men's and women's individual WCCTC championship titles shall be determined based on the season's omnium point totals. A plaque is awarded to first place, and gold, silver and bronze medals awarded to first through fifth places.
- 6.1.2. The WCCTC team title shall be determined based on the season's omnium point totals. A large plaque or trophy is awarded to the first place, and smaller plaques are awarded to second and third places.
- 6.1.3. In the case of a tie on total points, the tie will be broken in the favor of the athlete or team that has:
 - The most first place finishes or, if still tied, the most second place finishes, the most third place finishes, etc., or if still tied;
 - The highest placing in the last race, or the race nearest the last race of the omnium in which at least one of the tied athletes or teams placed.
- 6.1.4. If possible, the Conference awards shall be distributed at the last official race of the season. If this is not possible, another early-summer triathlon may be designated where a representative from each team can be in attendance.
 - 6.1.4.1. For the **2007-2008 race season** team and individual awards shall be distributed at the **San Jose International Triathlon**.
 - 6.1.4.2. The Director or an assistant must be in attendance to distribute awards.
- 6.1.5. It is the responsibility of the Director to obtain all team and individual awards.

7. BYLAWS

7.1. NAME, PURPOSE, AFFILIATION

- 7.1.1. The name of this organization shall be the West Coast Collegiate Triathlon Conference ("WCCTC").
- 7.1.2. The purpose of the WCCTC shall be to promote competitive triathlon for students at colleges, universities and similar degree-granting educational institutions in California and western Nevada.
- 7.1.3. The WCCTC shall be an association of the post-secondary schools of California and western Nevada.

7.2. EMBLEM

- 7.2.1. No person or organization may use the name or emblem of the WCCTC in advertising, soliciting goods or services, or promoting without the expressed or written consent of the Director.

7.3. EXECUTIVE BOARD

- 7.3.1. The governance of the WCCTC shall be vested in its Executive Board. The members of the Board shall consist of one representative, Team Rep., from each Conference school.
- 7.3.2. Team Reps serve a one-year term, beginning with the annual submission of the WCCTC Team Membership Application, as set forth in the Membership section. In the event a Team Rep resigns before his or her term has expired or is otherwise unable to complete his or her term, the team must immediately fill the position with another member.
- 7.3.3. Official business may be conducted over the Internet, using online voting tools.
- 7.3.4. The Board shall have the following standing committee(s).
 - 7.3.4.1. The Rules Committee shall be responsible for creating, interpreting, and amending the rules under which WCCTC competitions are held. The Director shall, with advice of the Board, interpret the racing rules in periods between meetings.
- 7.3.5. In addition, the Board may establish, regulate and disband other committees as necessary to achieve the purpose of the WCCTC.
- 7.3.6. The Board may set such other requirements for its committees as it sees fit.

7.4. AMENDMENTS

- 7.4.1. The Director may amend these bylaws subject to ratification by the Board. The approval of a majority of the Board is required for such an amendment to have effect.
- 7.4.2. Any Team Rep may propose an amendment. Such a proposal shall be submitted to the Director and shall be presented to the Board for a vote. Voting may occur during the competitive season only if the proposed amendment warrants immediate action. Otherwise, the proposed amendment shall be voted upon after the race season has completed.
- 7.4.3. Proposed amendments shall contain the following: The name of the proposal; the reason for the proposal; the effect of the proposal, if adopted; and a version of the portions of the bylaws to be amended that indicates what is to be added, what is to be deleted and what is to be changed.

8. WCCTC CHAMPIONS

8.1. TEAM AND INDIVIDUAL CHAMPIONS

- 8.1.1. **2006 WCCTC Overall Champions**
